PEN PAL PROGRAM GROWS FOR 2023-2024 SCHOOL YEAR

For many years, CC@H has had a Pen Pal Program with the ESOL Students at Chevy Chase Elementary School. The ESOL teacher, Maria York, finds it extremely valuable for the students to gain real life experience in written English. This school year, 2023-24 we have 10 students and volunteers with an ambitious goal to exchange 4 letters throughout the year.



The first letters from the students were received in mid-November and the assigned volunteer completed their letter back to their Pen Pal shortly before the Christmas Break. Ms. York wrote to tell us how excited the students were to get their letters.

In late January, volunteers received their second letter from the student and completed their second letter back to their student in mid-February. The third letter from the students will arrive at the end of March and volunteer replies will go back to the school at the end of April. The fourth round of letters will be exchanged before the end of the school year.

Only first names are used in correspondence. The letters are printed or typed by students and volunteers alike. The student letters contain a variety of colorful artwork and decoration. They have lots of questions for the volunteers; in return the volunteers have several questions for them. Volunteers find this program a most enjoyable and rewarding experience.

TURNING FAMILY STORIES INTO A HISTORICAL NOVEL WITH CHRISTINE KESSIDES

Christine Fallert Kessides, author of the recently-published debut novel *Magda, Standing*, will discuss how she took fragments of family lore to create a well-grounded story of German immigrants in the era of the Great War and the Spanish flu. After reviewing her family genealogy and reflecting on some of her relatives’ history as German immigrants, Christine was inspired to write *Magda, Standing*—a novel that may resonate with multiple generations — seniors who may recall their own grandparents talking about World War I, while younger audiences may relate to the teenage protagonist.

The story takes place in Pittsburgh in the years 1916-1919. It centers on a 16-year-old girl, Magda, who has to leave school to care for her ill mother and little brother. Faced with the looming Great War and a global pandemic (Spanish flu), Magda embarks on a journey of self-discovery that leads her back to embracing her family and caring for a wider community.

Christine was born and raised in Pittsburgh, PA. Before she retired, she was a policy analyst for the World Bank. Since then, she has served on the board and as grant committee co-chair for Giving Together. She lives in Chevy Chase Village with her

husband, and sees their four children, grandchildren, and grand dogs as often as possible.

Enjoy a guided photo journey of the most famous walking route in the world—the Camino de Santiago, known in English as the Way of St. James. It has become one of the world's most popular walking holidays and spiritual journeys. For more than 1,000 years, pilgrims and adventurers have made their way across Europe to visit the shrine of St. James the Great, now the Cathedral of Santiago de Compostela in northwestern Spain. Declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1985, the cathedral is the epitome of Romanesque architecture in Spain and the reputed burial place of the apostle Saint James the Great.

Our engaging and entertaining speaker, Kathleen McGuinness, is a Commissioner on the Council on Aging for Montgomery County. Her 500-mile foot journey was written up in *The Washington Post*. She is a 3rd generation Washingtonian who, while recuperating from a fall and four fractured vertebrae, decided to set a goal of walking the Camino. One year later, she started that trek.
