PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE -

I am honored and excited to have been elected the president of the Board of Directors of Chevy Chase At Home. I was fortunate to be involved in the first talks about forming a "village" in Chevy Chase more than six years ago, and I served on the first Board of Directors. We have grown considerably since 2011, when we had few members and volunteers, and a volunteer executive director.

Last year we delivered 700 services to members, from rides to medical appointments to



helping people learn how to use iPhones and communicate with email. We sponsor classes in Nathan Billig Pilates/Balance and Zumba and have offered lectures on travel, medical issues, financial security and more. We provide social activities, walks and discussion groups. We have increased the opportunities available to older adults in Chevy Chase, and we are thankful to our increasing membership, our faithful volunteers and supporters, our staff, and the leadership of the organization.

So where do we go from here? We have been successful, but there is more we can do. Not everyone in Chevy Chase knows we exist, and there are many in the community who have not taken advantage of our programs. There are people in our area who might enjoy volunteering by driving our members to various places nearby, or talking with them on a walk in the neighborhood, or helping with a small project in the house. unexpected visit from her Storm Buddy:

Betty had cataract surgery scheduled the day of the 3-inch January snowstorm that tied traffic into knots. A friend who had planned to drive her had to back out. She called two cab companies (3-hour wait time) and two neighbors who are MDs, neither of whom could drive her.



"...I just want to thank Chevy Chase At Home.
They got me to the hospital and I didn't have
to cancel my eye surgery - it was the last
resort! I have to thank Karen Spangler, a CC@
H Storm Buddy, for taking me. Thanks to all of
you, I went out for my check-up this morning
after eye surgery and for [many] years it's the
first time I did not have to reach for my
eyeglasses when I got up. I drove myself out
there [today] so he could check my eyes. I have
almost 20/20 vision and may not even need a
second operation. Thanks to Chevy Chase At
Home, I can see."

In a recent interview, Betty laughed as she said she hadn't made a single phone call to CC@ H. Storm Buddy Karen, whom Betty had never met, just showed up on her doorstep, snow shovel on shoulder, and asked if she'd like her walk shoveled. After that was done, and Betty had described her terrible dilemma, Karen offered, without being asked, to take her to the hospital. Storm Buddy mission accomplished!

Postscript: In early February, Betty had the same operation on her other eye. Her chauffeur, who picked her up at 6:15 a.m., was CC@ H Volunteer Janet Regan.

TECHNOLOGY CLASSES

In response to strong member interest,
TechMoxie will offer CC@ H Members and
Chevy Chase Village residents two
technology classes designed for beginners
who want to exploit fully the capabilities of
their iPhones and iPads. TechMoxie, a local
firm specializing in technology training for
older adults, will provide the instructor and
supporting handouts. Each course will last 3 weeks
and will be given at the CC Village Hall. A minimum
of 8 and maximum of 10 students is required for
each course, so register early to assure your place at
the table.

- iPhone ABCs will cover all the essentials of iPhone use, including making and receiving calls, taking pictures, adding and using Apps, video chatting and more. After you complete this course, you will love your iPhone and all it can do for you! Bring your iPhone to the course. Register early to avoid disappointment. Cost: \$45 for Members and Village residents. Dates: Wednesdays on April 15, 22 and 29 from 2:00 to 3:00 p.m. at the CC Village Hall.

- Getting to Know Your iPad: This course teaches the basics of iPad use, beginning with how to navigate settings, exploit apps, send and receive email and manipulate the internet. Particular attention will be paid to the selection and employment of apps. A great range of apps is available for all interests, but each is different. The course will teach students the navigation techniques which apply to every app. Written instructions will be provided, but students must bring their own iPads to class. Early registration is recommended.

Cost: \$45 for Members and Village residents. Dates: Wednesdays on May 6, 13 and 20 from 2:00 to 3:00 p.m. at the Chevy Chase Village Hall.

Be sure to indicate which course you wish to attend. The small classes (<u>8 minimum</u>, <u>10 maximum</u>) guarantee virtually personal instruction, but the limited number of places available also dictates early registration to avoid disappointment.
